The scores from the pre- and post-test will be compared using a paired T-test to see whether or not our project made a positive influence on these children. An abstract will be submitted to AACP for the 2008 annual meeting.

Our P1 students participated in the MyStudentBody.com alcohol educational series this past semester (Fall 2007). A pre- and post-survey has already been given, and a second post-survey will be given in January (three months after they completed the program). These surveys will be compared in many different ways to see what impact this program had on our students' behaviors, attitudes, and knowledge surrounding the use of alcohol. An abstract will be submitted to AACP for the 2008 annual meeting. We will also write a research article on the entire project for submission in a peer-reviewed journal.
